Mount Eagle Windfarm, which is currently constructing a 5 MW windfarm at Mount Eagle, Cordal, Castleisland, Co. Kerry, has noticed that a Grid Application for Phase 2, an additional 1.7MW has not been included in the proposed Gate 1. Mount Eagle had originally made an application for a 6.8MW windfarm, but due to lack of capacity at the substation in Castleisland, initially a grid connection for only 5.1MW could be offered. In consultation with Mary Shannon, it was agreed that a new separate application should be made for the remaining two turbines.

The application, D47/6140 was posted from this office to Mary Shannon, ESB in Cork on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December 2003. Please see copy of cover letter as received by ESB attached. According to An Post best practise the letter should be delivered the following day namely the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December, in which case the completed application arrived before the Moratorium was introduced late afternoon 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2003.

The application was deemed complete on the 5<sup>th</sup> December 2003, please see attached email from Mary Shannon dated 16<sup>th</sup> January 2004.

Mount Eagle contends that due to lack of best practise in An Post, Mount Eagle should not suffer and the application should be included in Gate 1.
