Water charge plan

Dear sir or madam.

It is not often that I find myself having to contact a Regulator in relation to any service I use. But I find myself dismayed that the one body that is there to protect the general public can be swayed so much as to allow a child's access to water be restricted in such a way as is proposed by Irish Water. How can any body or state agree that a child will only use the toilet once a day and shower once a day also. What about a child's health and the need for drinking water, water for cooking their food and washing their clothes, where in the proposed allowance of 21,000 litres can a family find that.

There was a COMMITMENT by the present government to provide free water to all children of this state. I therefore request that you, as the Regulator, insist that children be allowed the proposed 38,000 litres as promised by the government, if over time Irish Water and you find that children don't need that much water then you can review that allowance and bring it down in accordance with the accurate information on hand i.e. Meter readings from homes with children and from homes without children.
